Some of the services we have provided in our local areas include: providing eyeglasses for those who cannot afford them, providing Leader Dogs for the blind, building handicap ramps, doing photo-screening of pre-school children's eyes, providing scholarships for students' continuing education, sponsoring youth sports teams, partnering with other local non-profit service organizations by ringing bells for the Salvation Army, collecting food for local food banks, providing cookies for Cancer Services patients, providing

Indiana Lions Clubs partner together to support our 5 state projects:

The Lions Cancer Control Project at the IU Medical Center in Indianapolis by providing funds for equipment and research. Indiana Lions provided one million dollars toward the purchase of the Gamma Knife, allowing non-invasive brain tumor surgery.

The Lions Eye & Tissue Bank, the second largest tissue bank in North America, collects corneas, organs, bones and skin tissue for transplants and research. It is the second largest tissue bank in North America.

The Lions Leader Dog Project works with people raising puppies that will be trained for Leader Dogs. It also supports our Leader Dog School in Rochester Hills, MI. Each Leader Dog costs over \$35,000. Lions can provide transportation to and from the school for the 4 week training. The recipient does not pay for the dog, the room & board or the training.

The Lions Speech & Hearing Project provides temporary loaner hearing aids to adults, children and babies. It also provides temporary loaner equipment which allows a person who can not speak. to communicate.

The Lions for The Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired helps the school by providing equipment and labor for items not covered by state funding. We have purchased special computers with voice programs, a specially equipped playground for the children and we have Work Days at the school where we have painted dorms, pulled weeds, picked up limbs, etc.

Our Lions Foundations provide grants to help fund Lions Club service projects and for weather related disasters.

Scholarship Program

The Lions of District 25 D have established a Scholarship Program for seniors in high school or being home-schooled who are endeavoring to further their education. The scholarship amount will be FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500) and shall be used to assist in the expense of tuition and/or books at a university, vocational, or technical school. This scholarship is open to seniors living in and attending a high school, or being home-schooled in Blackford, Delaware, Grant, Hamilton, Howard, Jay, Madison, Tipton or Randolph County.

The following criteria must also be met in order to be eligible for consideration:

- An accumulative grade point of average of 2.5 or more
- Completed information and application pages
- Applicant’s Information page signed by your high school counselor, Dean, or other school administrator
- Applicant’s Information page signed by a sponsoring Lions Club officer
- Complete an essay of at least 200 words on why you deserve this scholarship and how you plan to utilize it.
- Complete Application must be submitted no later than **APRIL 1, 2010**
